
Materials Needed

a printed copy of the attached pinwheel scissors push pin pencil with an eraser


How to Assemble Your Pinwheel

- 1. Print your selected design (color is best).
- 2. Following the dashed lines, cut around the outside edge.
- 3. Cut along the dashed lines from each corner toward the center. Don't go too far!
- 4. Using your push pin, punch a hole in each of the 4 corners (in the corner where there is not any text).
- 5. Pull punched corners down one at a time towards the center point and secure them one by one with the push pin.
- 6. Place the pencil on a flat surface. Hold your pinwheel carefully, and push the pin into the side of the pencil eraser.
- 7. Your pinwheel is ready. Walk forward and watch it spin!


Pinwheel for Children
