
Award Honors Work for Women and Families

The Vita et Caritas Award was established in 2015 in honor of the memory of Ruthie Ford, whose life reflected Catholic ideals and tireless dedication to service in the cause of helping women, children, and families. Ruthie Ford was a long-time member of the Board of Directors of the Bishop's Charitable Assistance Fund and served as secretary. She and her husband, Pat Ford, were among the first supporters of the Fund when it began in 1985.

The award is presented annually to an individual associated with a non-profit organization who makes significant contributions that help to transform the lives of women, children, or families, and who exemplifies in his/her service the gospel message to love others. Ruthie Ford's family established the award and funds the grant that goes to the organization with which the individual is involved.

Last year, we presented the eighth *Vita et Caritas Award* to Dawn Longval. Ms. Longval is President of Isaiah 61 Café, in Laconia, NH. Isaiah 61 Café offers the homeless "friends" a continental breakfast, hot lunch, much needed bathroom facilities, hot showers, washers and dryers, and lockers to try to make up for all they lack. Isaiah 61 Café is 100% volunteer-based. They have around 32 volunteers and no one receives compensation, leaving 100% of donations to be used for their mission.

It all began in 2017, when Dawn Longval and a few friends went to Rotary Park in Laconia every Wednesday (no matter the weather) and brought music, water, sandwiches, and love to the homeless and less fortunate families. Through this outreach, the homeless began to trust and appreciate their



kindness and many became motivated to enter rehabs and change their lives for the better. This humble beginning encouraged Dawn and her husband, Dave, to purchase the building for Isaiah 61 Café with their own money and

refitted it to fill the needs of the homeless and opened in June of 2018.

Since that time, the Longvals have overseen the development

of the Café and recently bought an addition to the original building and opened a "wet shelter." Even though Dawn is a devoted mother to 6 children, she volunteers most of her time at the Café. Although her husband has a successful marketing company, he works at the Café when Dawn can't be there. Dawn is also a CPA and has saved the Café lots of money by doing almost all the financial work required for the operation.

During the summer, the Café provides a safe place for children of all ages to be nourished both physically and spiritually. While at the Café both adults and children experience a respite and find hope through acoustic worship. They are offered clothing and other necessities. The Café provides gifts at Christmas for the parents to give to their children, even to those parents who are in prison.

The Café is based on Matthew 11:28: "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest." Dawn is so loving, non-judgmental, and patient with their friends. She plays the guitar and sings songs of comfort. Dawn provides Bible sharing 6 times per week and worship 4 times. She truly radiates her love of God. They rent their facility to the Waters Edge Christian Church on Sundays where Dawn often leads worship and many of their friends attend regularly.

BCAF Reports Annual Activity for 2022-2023

The Bishop's Charitable Assistance Fund has allocated \$191,000 in grants since July 1, 2022. This year we have distributed funds to 59 worthy organizations throughout the state of New Hampshire. There is an additional \$20,000 earmarked for emergency allocations. Any unallocated funds from previous years are rolled over and made available for grants in the new fiscal year.



How Your Legacy Can Carry On

Whoever cares for the poor lends to the Lord, who will pay back the sum in full. (Proverbs 19:17)

Have you ever thought about your legacy? You may faithfully be making annual donations to the charitable organizations that are important to you and your family, but have you considered what will happen when you pass on and are no longer able to make those annual donations? Planned giving, also referred to as gift planning or legacy giving, is a donor's intention to contribute a planned gift to an organization beyond their lifetime. This is often a continuation of the donations an individual or couple has made while living, but on a larger scale. A planned gift can be as simple as a cash bequest to a charitable organization in a Will or Trust, a gift of stocks or bonds, or the designation of a charitable organization as the beneficiary of a life insurance policy, annuity or IRA. A donor can even specify the purpose of the gift and/ or limit the amount of the gift that the organization may spend annually.

The BCAF has been the recipient of three legacy gifts over the last number of years. We are using these gifts to enhance our grantmaking to more organizations in need. It is thanks to the continued support of donors, like our legacy donors, that we are able to assist so many not-for-profit organizations that improve the quality of life and provide basic essentials for individuals and families in New Hampshire, especially the poor and disadvantaged. We honor these families for their longterm support and for making a final gift to the BCAF possible through their wills and estate plans.
