This file contains information and nomination forms for the Catholic Adult Recognition Awards for Boy Scout and Girl Scout leaders, including American Heritage leaders.

These awards are given in recognition of significant contribution to the faith development of Catholic Scouts. They are not presented as recognition solely for good Scouting service, but for contribution to the faith development of scouts. Adults cannot nominate themselves for these awards. More detailed information for each award is provided in this package.

The awards are presented at the annual Bishop's Scouting Recognition Ceremony, held at St. Joseph Cathedral. The deadline for nominations is usually two months prior to the ceremony. Nominations will be accepted at any time. The person who nominates is responsible for arranging payment for the medals to the Diocese. Payment will be due following approval of the candidate.

Bronze Pelican Award – a Diocesan level award presented to someone who has made a significant contribution to the faith development of Catholic Boy Scouts. The pelican is an ancient Christian symbol which has several meanings. One aspect of the symbolism describes the relationship of Jesus Christ with his people by referring to how a mother pelican will give her life's blood to her young to nurture and protect it. The early Christians had a liturgical symbol of the pelican as a representation of Christ. The significance of the Bronze Pelican Emblem is Christ-like devotion to youth. It acknowledges that adults in scouting are called to nurture and raise our scouts in Catholic ideals. The Bronze Pelican Award recognizes adults who have made contributions to the spiritual development of youth in scouting. The requirements are somewhat less rigorous than for the St. George Award. Only in exceptional cases would the presentation of a Bronze Pelican Award not precede the presentation of a St. George Award to the same honoree. <http://www.nccs-bsa.org/index.php/adult-recognition/bronze-pelican>

St. George Award - a National level award presented to someone who has made an outstanding contribution to the faith development of Catholic Boy Scouts. The National Catholic Committee on Scouting and the National Council of the Boy Scouts of America, having observed the use and value of an award presented to adults for outstanding service to the spiritual development of Catholic Youth in the Scouting program, approved the St. George Emblem in 1955.

St. George, who died a martyr in the year 303, was the patron saint of knighthood and of England. The principal order of knighthood in England was placed under the patronage of St. George. The feast day of St. George, April 23, was a national holiday and a holy day of obligation for English Catholics for many years.

Early stories of St. George's knighthood describes his public witnessing of his faith, his arrest, brave suffering

and martyrdom. A later legend, which added a description of St. George as a knight who rescued the king's daughter in Libya, was probably responsible for much of the popularity given to St. George as a defender of virtue even at the risk of life itself. As a person who spent his own life in the service of others, St. George is an appropriate saint for scouts. The ideals of scouting describe many of the virtues demanded of those who would be knights. Scouts and scouters are called upon to make a public commitment to these ideals. The St. George Emblem identifies and gives the highest recognition to members of the clergy and laity, scouters and non-scouters alike who have made outstanding contributions to the spiritual development of Catholic youth in scouting: <http://www.nccs-bsa.org/index.php/adult-recognition/st-george>

St. Anne Award –The St. Anne Medal is the highest national recognition for adults who serve Catholic youth through Girl Scouts or American Heritage. The recognition was inaugurated in 1957. The purposes of the St. Anne recognition are to honor the outstanding services of adults who contribute to the spiritual development of Catholic young people Scouting and to further Catholic adult leadership in youth ministry through national youth serving organizations.

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Award - a Diocesan level award presented to someone who has made a significant contribution to the faith development of Catholic Girl Scouts and American Heritage Girls. The St. Elizabeth Ann Seton recognition was inaugurated in 1980 to recognize the meritorious contributions of adults who serve Catholic youth through Girl Scouts. This medal affirms the work of those who help youth develop their spiritual lives within the context of the organization. It is ordinarily received before the St. Anne Medal is earned, but is not a requirement for receiving the St. Anne Medal.



Fact Sheet for Bronze Pelican Award

The Bronze Pelican Award is given by the Diocese of Manchester to an adult registered with the Boy Scouts of America who has made a significant contribution to the spiritual growth of Catholic youth in the Boy Scout/Cub Scout program through exemplary service.

This award is not given to recognize accomplishments or service within the overall Boy Scout program, since the Boy Scouts have recognition for such achievements. It is given to recognize those whose efforts have helped to promote the spiritual development of Catholic members of the Boy Scouts.

It is not as much length of service as the degree of effort and commitment and the results of that effort that are considered for this award. Some examples of activities that might be considered depending on the commitment and the effect of the activities in helping Catholic youth grow in their faith within Boy Scouts are:

- Serving as a counselor, moderator or coordinator; promoting the religious emblems programs for Catholic Scouts and others.
- Promoting Catholic Scout activities and Scout service projects for the church and being willing to serve on committees for those purposes.
- Participating and helping at the annual Diocesan Scout Retreat and promoting the retreat within Scout units.
- Showing outstanding service and commitment in organizing and maintaining Catholic-chartered Scouting units.
- Insuring the opportunity for Scouts and leaders to attend Mass at camporees and summer camps and also providing for the spiritual needs of non-Catholic Scouts.
- Providing leadership and examples of commitment to the Catholic faith in organizing Scout Sundays, religious award presentation, and other religious events.

An adult may be recommended for this award by anyone who believes the candidate meets these criteria. Recommendation must be made on the nomination form provided by the Diocesan Catholic Committee on Scouting. Not all candidates nominated become recipients. Awards are presented at the annual Bishop's Scouting Recognition Ceremony. Check with the Catholic Committee on Scouting for any deadlines for award submission.

The St. Anne Medal is a national award presented by the Diocese of Manchester to an adult registered with the Girl Scouts of the U.S.A. or American Heritage Girls who has made an especially noteworthy contribution to the spiritual growth of Catholic Scouts through outstanding service. The award is made on the basis of the candidate's own spiritual life and outstanding spiritual contribution to girls in Scouting.

This award is not given to recognize accomplishments or service within the overall Girl Scout or American Heritage program, since these organizations have recognition for such achievements. It is given to recognize those whose efforts have significantly helped to promote the spiritual development of Catholic Girl Scouts and American Heritage Girls.

It is not as much length of service as the amount of commitment and the impact of that effort that are considered for this award. Some examples of activities that might be considered depending on the commitment and the effect of the activities in helping Catholic Girl Scouts and American Heritage Girls grow in their faith are:

- Significant and sustained service in promoting the religious emblems programs for Catholic Girl Scouts and American Heritage Girls, such as recruiting counselor/moderators and helping them receive training, serving as a counselor/moderator, achieving significant results in encouraging girls to work on level –appropriate religious emblems.
- Significant assistance in planning and/or conducting the annual Diocesan Scout Retreat and promoting the retreat within Girl Scout and American Heritage groups.
- Providing significant and sustained leadership and examples of commitment to the Catholic faith in organizing and facilitating Catholic Girl Scout and American Heritage participation at Girl Scout Sundays, religious award presentations, and other religious events.

BACKGROUND

National Catholic Committee for Girl Scouts and Camp Fire suggests the following guidelines for adult recognitions: In February 1982, the National Subcommittee on Girls Organizations (predecessor to NCCGSCF) developed the guidelines contained here. They are national requirements; and are offered for your consideration in a spirit of service to diocesan committees and leaders.

AIMS AND PURPOSES

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Award

The St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Award was created by the Department of Education, USCC (now USCCB), in 1980 to recognize the significant contributions of persons serving the spiritual needs of Catholic members in organizations serving girls. It is offered to those dioceses that choose to use it, subject to the approval of the local ordinary. It is intended to recognize notable contributions to this field of youth ministry, although the St. Anne Medal remains the highest national award.

St. Anne Award

The St. Anne Medal for adults working with Catholic members of national organizations serving girls is an award of the Department of Education, USCC. It was inaugurated at the Sixth National Conference on Catholic Youth Work in Philadelphia in November 1957 and it was redesigned in 1980. It is offered to those dioceses which choose to use it, subject to the approval of the local ordinary. It is the highest national award in this field. The purpose of the award is to honor the outstanding service of adults contributing to the spiritual development of Catholic members of organizations for girls, and to further Catholic adult leadership in youth ministry through those organizations.

SELECTION PROCESS

- * Nominations and recommendations may be made by anyone, using the official nomination forms obtained from the diocesan Catholic committee, youth director, or chaplain of the above organizations. Persons who were nominated in a previous year but were not selected may be re-nominated if still eligible.
- * No honorary awards should be made.
- * A local diocesan selection committee should determine recipients of the awards. It is suggested that the committee be composed of five to seven members, including the diocesan youth director, and/or diocesan chaplain. If possible, the committee should include previous recipients of the St. Anne Award. Selections made by the committee and approved by the diocesan youth director and/or chaplain will be final. The committee should be appointed and activated at least sixty days before the date of presentation.

CANDIDATE QUALIFICATIONS

- * The kind of person sought as a recipient of a national adult recognition should be one of excellent character and exemplary in every way.
- * Recipients should be adults currently active with the organizations served (ideally, registered members).
- * There are no national restrictions regarding recipients. Awards may be given to clergy, religious, non-Catholics, lay men or women.
- * Catholic recipients should be exemplary Catholics, with the support of their parish community and their respective pastors. Non-Catholic recipients should also be supported by their congregations and clergy.

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton

The Nominee:

- (1) has given a minimum of three years active service to youth as an adult member.
- (2) participates in activities which contribute to the spiritual development of Catholic members of national organizations serving girls; e.g., retreat weekends, days of recollection, Girl Scout Sunday observances, etc.
- (3) promotes the religious recognition programs available to Catholic members in the diocese and/or serves as a counselor.
- (4) participates actively in adult spiritual motivation days.
- (5) is responsible for Catholic members fulfilling their responsibility to Mass while camping.
- (6) encourages the true spirit of ecumenism as well as parochial responsibility and Catholic leadership within the girls' organization served.
- (7) contributes other service to the parish and community.

St. Anne

The Nominee:

- (1) has given a minimum of seven years active service to youth as an adult member.
- (2) promotes the religious recognition programs for Catholic members and/or serves as a counselor. Encourages non-Catholic members to participate in the religious recognitions of their faith.
- (3) gives notable service in promoting Catholic activities and service projects for the church and shows willingness to serve on like committees.
- (4) participates actively in the adult spiritual motivation program, retreats or days of recollection. Is instrumental in having others participate.
- (5) gives outstanding service in promoting and participating in Girl Scout/Camp Fire Sunday observances.
- (6) gives notable service in extending the national organizations to more members under Catholic auspices.
- (7) assists parishes and Catholic organizations in recruiting adults for key leadership positions.
- (8) is fully trained in the skills of the organization and is outstanding for his/her sense of responsibility, humility, and good example.
- (9) is responsible for Catholic members being transported to Mass at camporees and summer camps and provides for spiritual needs of the non-Catholics within these groups.
- (10) creates a better understanding of the aims and ideals of the organizations by the clergy and laity through the Catholic press and other communications media.
- (11) is instrumental in organizing and promoting these programs for all members regardless of race or creed and gives leadership.
- (12) encourages the true spirit of ecumenism as well as parochial responsibility and Catholic leadership within the girls' organizations served.
- (13) fosters good relationship with council and is capable of interpreting Catholic programs to council members.
