

10:30 a.m. Pontifical Mass:

- Introit, Congregational Refrain and Psalm verses replace the Processional Hymn.
- Act of Penitence (in the various forms) and Gloria are always sung.
- Communion Antiphon, Congregational Refrain and Psalm verses replace the Communion Chant.

At the time of the writing and publication of this annual *hymnlist* we are still in the midst of the global COVID-19 pandemic. As a result, full choral ensembles are not in session, assembly singing is not encouraged, large gatherings limited and the distribution of worship aids prohibited. Routine and everyday life came to an abrupt halt throughout the entirety of the world in the first few months of 2020. Effecting every aspect of communal, personal and commercial life here in the United States and around the globe, churches were forced to close and many still remain so today. [As a side note, this greatly affected Holy Week of 2020. The Vatican decree: "In Time of COVID" is included in the appendix]. As of yet, our calendars remain to be codified because the future remains very uncertain. All concerts have been canceled this coming year including the annual performance of Messiah and Lessons and Carols. Hopefully the situation improves in 2021. Taking this into account, the *hymnlist* is extremely tentative in nature and meant to serve as a loose reference to help guide the Cathedral music ministry forward.

### **ORDINARY TIME**

Due to COVID-19, assembly singing is not being encouraged. Although hymns are listed, we will be using the Introit and Communion Antiphon along with the congregational refrain and psalm verses. Instrumental music will serve during the Offertory and in place of a Recessional Hymn. We will also switch-out the ordinaries for lesser known settings. Admittedly, this is not optimal and contrary to what we typically strive to achieve. However, using less familiar music will enable us to maintain a certain style of liturgy while minimizing assembly participation. This move is temporary. We will resort to normal praxis when the current health situation has abated. Our Lady, Comforter of the Afflicted, pray for us.





"Advent has a two-fold character: as a sermon to prepare for Christmas when Christ's first coming to us is remembered; as a season when that remembrance directs our mind and heart to await Christ's second coming at the end of time. Advent thus is a period of devout and joyful expectation." (General Norms for the Liturgical Year and Calendar, #39).

#### LENT

The annual Lenten season is the fitting time to climb the holy mountain of Easter. The Lenten season has a double character, namely to prepare both catechumens and faithful to celebrate the paschal mystery. The catechumens, both with the rite of elections and scrutinizes, and by catechesis, are prepared for the celebration of the sacraments of Christian initiation; the faithful, ever more attentive to the Word of God and prayer, prepare themselves by penance, for the renewal of their baptismal promises (*Caremoniale episcoporum*, 249).





# HOLY WEEK AND EASTER TRIDUUM

Christ redeemed us all and gave perfect glory to God principally through his paschal mystery: dying he destroyed our death and rising he restored our life. Therefore, the Easter triduum of the passion and resurrection of Christ is the culmination of the entire liturgical year. Thus the solemnity of Easter has the same kind of preeminence in the liturgical year that Sunday has in the week. The Easter triduum begins with the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper, reaches its high point in the Easter vigil, and closes with evening prayer on Easter Sunday (General Norms, 18-19).

Sunday 28 March 2021: Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord

On this day the Church recalls the entrance of Christ the Lord into Jerusalem to accomplish his Paschal Mystery. Accordingly, the memorial of this entrance of the Lord takes place at all masses, by means of the Procession or the Solemn Entrance before the principal Mass or the Simple Entrance before other Masses. The Solemn Entrance, but not the Procession, may be repeated before other Masses that are usually celebrated with a large gathering of people. It is desirable that, where neither the Procession nor the Solemn Entrance can take place, there be a sacred celebration of the Word of God on the messianic entrance and on the Passion of the Lord, either on a Saturday evening or on Sunday at a convenient time.

#### Tuesday 30 March 2021:

All Christians are anointed because all are filled with the Spirit's gifts for the building up of the church and the church's service to the world. In every local church one Christian presides in love and orchestrates the church's ministry. This is the bishop, or chief pastor. It is not surprising, therefore, that the most ancient liturgical witnesses designate the bishop as the consecrator of the sacramental oils. Although priests once blessed the oils of the catechumens and the sick and may do so in some circumstances, only the bishop may consecrate the chrism with which the baptized are sealed at confirmation and ordination. This rite is one of the last rites of preparation before the Triduum begins. Before the local church baptizes, it prepares the chrism which will be used in the Vigil.

This celebration has always retained a special character of collegiality. Even in the centuries when Eucharistic concelebration had disappeared from the church's life, the ritual for the blessing and consecration of oils retained strong elements which reminded all that ministry in the church is never the work of an individual but part of a community of ministers of different gifts and responsibilities. The present celebration of the rite has been restored as full concelebration of the bishop with his clergy and with the full participation of the laity.



At the Last Supper, on the night when he was betrayed, our Savior instituted the Eucharistic Sacrifice of His body and blood. The tabernacle should be empty: a sufficient number of hosts should be consecrated at this Mass for the communion of the clergy and laity today and tomorrow. The reception of the holy oils blessed at the Chrism Mass may be received by the local community either before this liturgy or at another appropriate time. Mass begins with the Entrance Antiphon or an appropriate hymn.



### PART II: ADORATION OF THE HOLY CROSS

The Deacon accompanied by ministers, or another suitable minister, goes to the sacristy, from which, in procession, accompanied by two ministers with lighted candles, he carries the Cross, covered with a violet veil, through the church to the middle of the sanctuary. The Priest, standing before the altar and facing the people, receives the Cross, uncovers a little of its upper part and elevates it while beginning the Ecce lingum Crucis (Behold the wood of the Cross). He is assisted in singing by the Deacon or, if need be, by the choir. All respond, Come, let us adore. At the end of the singing, all kneel and for a brief moment adore in silence, while the Priest stand and holds the Cross raised.



Then the Priest uncovers the right arm of the Cross and again, raising up the Cross, begins, **Behold the** wood of the Cross, and everything takes place as above. Finally, he uncovers the Cross entirely and, raising it up, he begins the invitation **Behold the wood of the Cross** a third time and everything takes place like the first time. On Holy Saturday the Church waits at the Lord's tomb in prayer and fasting, meditation on his Passion and Death and on his Descent into Hell, and awaiting his Resurrection. The Church abstains from the Sacrifice of the Mass, with the sacred table left bare, until after the solemn Vigil, that is, the anticipation by night of the Resurrection, when the time comes for paschal joys, the abundance of which overflows to occupy fifty days. Holy Communion may only be given on this day as Viaticum.

The Great Vigil of Easter, 8:00 p.m.

By most ancient tradition, this is the night of keeping vigil for the Lord (Ex 12:42), in which, following the Gospel admonition (Lk 12:35-37), the faithful, carrying lighted lamps in their hands, should be like those looking for the Lord when he returns, so that at his coming he may find them awake and have them sit at his table. Of this night's Vigil, which is the greatest and most noble of all solemnities, there is to be only celebration in each church. It is arranged, moreover, in such a way that after the Lucernarium and Easter Proclamation (which constitutes the first part of this Vigil), Holy Church meditates on the wonders the Lord God has done for his people from the beginning, trusting in his word and promise (the second part, that is, the Liturgy of the Word) until, as day approaches, with new members reborn in Baptism (the third part), the Church is called to the table the Lord has prepared for his people, the memorial of his Death and Resurrection until he comes again (the fourth part).

#### PART I: LUCERNARIUM

The Blessing of the Fire and Preparation of the Candle

**PROCESSION:** When the candle has been lit, one of the ministers takes burning coals from the firs and places them in the thurible, and the Priest puts incense into it in the usual way. The Deacon or, if there is no Deacon, another suitable minister, takes the paschal candle and a procession forms. The thurifer with the smoking thurible precedes the Deacon or other minister who carries the paschal candle. After them follows the Priest with the ministers and the people, all holding in their hands unlit candles.

At the door of the church, the Deacon or other suitable minister, standing and raising up the candle, sings: Priest/Deacon intones: "The Light of Christ." *or* "Lumen Christi."

Cantor and Assembly: "Thanks be to God." or "Deo gratias."



The Priest lights his candle from the flame of the paschal candle. Then the Deacon processes to the middle of the darkened church and, standing and raising up the candle, sings a second time:

"The Light of Christ." or "Lumen Christi."

ALL: "Thanks be to God." or "Deo gratias."

All light their candles from the Easter candle and continue in procession. When the Deacon arrives before the altar, he stands facing the people, raises up the candle and sings a third time:

"The Light of Christ." or "Lumen Christi."

ALL: "Thanks be to God." or "Deo gratias."

### PART II: LITURGY OF THE WORD

There are seven readings from the Old Testament and two from the New (the Epistle and Gospel), all of which should be read whenever this can be done, so that the character of the Vigil, which demands an extended period of time, may be preserved. Nevertheless, where more serious pastoral circumstances demand it, the number of readings from the Old Testament may be reduced, always bearing in mind that the reading of the Word of God is a fundamental part of this Easter Vigil. At least three readings should be read from the Old Testament, both from the Law and from the Prophets, and their respective Responsorial Psalms should be sung. Never, moreover, should the reading of chapter 14 of Exodus with its canticle be omitted. Following each reading from the Old Testament the Responsorial Psalm is sung. Then all rise, the Bishop says, "Let us pray" and, after all have prayed for a while in silence, he says the prayer corresponding to the reading.





# EASTER SEASON

During the Easter Season, the Church extends the joy and gladness of Easter day throughout several weeks. The Solemnity of Easter itself, and I particular the Great Easter Vigil, is the highpoint of the liturgical year. Since the celebration of the Easter feast is of such pre-eminence, the Church extends that celebration for seven days, called Easter Week. Each day of Easter Week is a solemnity of high rank, and rituals peculiar to Easter (like the double "Alleluia" sung at the dismissal) are continued each day during Easter Week. The importance of the "Week of Easters" is such that the Church multiplies it seven times seven, creating a **season** of joy and festivity. Thus, the Easter Season is highly symbolic in length, a season of 7 times 7 days, culminating in the descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost (*pente* meaning "fiftieth").



Offertory Antiphon: Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord; we bless you from the house of the Lord. The Lord is God, and he has given us light. [Verses of Psalm 45 or Psalm 96 can also be sung between repetitions of the antiphon.]

Communion Antiphon: This is he of whom John said: I have seen and have given witness that this is the Son of God. (John 1:32, 34)

## Ash Wednesday

Introit: Lord, you are merciful to all, and hate nothing you have created. You overlook the sins of men to bring them to repentance. You are the Lord our God. (Wisdom 11:24-25, 27)

Antiphons during the Distribution of Ashes:

- 1. Come back to the Lord with all your heart; leave the past in ashes, and return to God with tears and fasting, for he is slow to anger and ready to forgive. (Joel 2:13).
- 2. Let the priests and ministers of the Lord lament before his altar, and say: Spare us, Lord; spare your people! Do not let us die for we are crying out to you. (Joel 2:17; Est 13:17)
- 3. Lord, take away our wickedness. (Psalm 51:3)

## These may be repeated after each verse of Psalm 51

Offertory Antiphon: I will extol you, O Lord, for you drew me clear and did not let my enemies rejoice over me. O Lord, my God, I cried out to you and you healed me. [Verses of Psalm 91 can also be sung between repetitions of the antiphon.]

Communion Antiphon: The man who meditates day and night on the law of the Lord will yield fruit in due season (Psalm 1:2-3)

#### ✤ First Sunday of Lent

Introit: When he calls to me, I will answer; I will rescue him and give him honor. Long life and contentment will be his. (Psalm 91:15-16)

Offertory Antiphon: With his pinions he will cover you, and under his wings you shall take refuge; his faithfulness is a buckler and a shield. [Verses of Psalm 91 can also be sung between repetitions of the antiphon.]

Communion Antiphon: Man does not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes forth from the mouth of God. (Matthew 4:4)

#### ✤ Second Sunday of Lent

Introit: Remember your mercies, Lord, your tenderness from ages past. Do not let our enemies triumph over us; O God, deliver Israel from all her distress. (Psalm 25:6,3, 22)

Offertory Antiphon: I will delight in your commands, which I love. I will lift up my hands to your commands and meditate on your statutes. [Verses of Psalm 91 can also be sung between repetitions of the antiphon.]

Communion Antiphon: This is my Son, my beloved, in whom is all my delight: Listen to him. (Matthew 17:5)

## ✤ Third Sunday of Lent

Introit: My eyes are ever fixed on the Lord, for he releases my feet from the snare, O look at me and be merciful, for I am wretched and alone. (Psalm 25:15-16)

Offertory Antiphon: The precepts of the Lord are right, rejoicing the heart; the command of the Lord is clear, enlightening the eye; sweeter also than syrup or honey from the comb. Your servant is careful of them, very diligent in keeping them. [Verses of Psalm 91 can also be sung between repetitions of the antiphon.]

Communion Antiphon: Whoever drinks the water that I shall give him, says the Lord, will have a spring inside him, welling up for eternal life. (John 4:13-14)

## 

Introit: Rejoice, Jerusalem! Be glad for her, you who love her; rejoice with her, you who mourned for her, and you will find contentment at her consoling breasts. (Isaiah 66:10-11)

Offertory Antiphon: Praise the Lord, for he is good; sing praise to his name, which we love. All that the Lord wills he does. [Verses of Psalm 91 can also be sung between repetitions of the antiphons.]

Communion Antiphon: The Lord rubbed my eyes: I went away and washed; then I could see, and I believed in God (John 9:11)

## ✤ Fifth Sunday of Lent

Introit: Give me justice, O God, and defend my cause against the wicked; rescue me from deceitful and unjust men. You, O God, are my refuge. (Psalm 43:1-2)

Offertory Antiphon: I will give you thanks with an upright heart, with all my heart I seek you. Be good to your servant, that I may live and keep your words; give me life according to your word. [Verses of Psalm 91 can also be sung between repetitions of the antiphon.]

Communion Antiphon: He who lives and believes in me will not die for ever, said the Lord. (John 11:26)

# HOLY WEEK AND EASTER TRIDUUM

♥ Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion

Introit: Hosanna to the Son of David, the King of Israel. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest. (Matthew 21:9)

Procession Antiphons:

- 1. The children of Jerusalem welcomed Christ the King. They carried olive branches and loudly praised the Lord: Hosanna in the highest. [*Between verses of Psalm 24*]
- 2. The children of Jerusalem welcomed Christ the King. They spread their cloaks before him and loudly praised the Lord: Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! [*Between verses of Psalm 47*]
- 3. The children of Jerusalem welcomed Christ the King. They proclaimed the resurrection of life; and waiving olive branches, they loudly praised the Lord: Hosanna in the highest.
- 4. When the people heard that Jesus was entering Jerusalem, they went to meet him and, waving olive branches, they loudly praised the Lord: Hosanna in the highest.

Offertory Antiphon: Insult has broken my heart, and I am weak, I looked for sympathy, but there was none; for comforters, and I found none. Rather they put gall in my food, and in my thirst they gave me vinegar to drink. (Psalm 69:21-22) [*Verses of Psalm 22 can also be sung between repetitions of the antiphon*.]

Communion Antiphon: Father, if this cup may not pass, but I must drink it, then your will be done. (Matthew 26:42)

## Tuesday of Holy Week / Chrism Mass

Introit: Jesus Christ has made us a kingdom of priests to serve his God and Father: glory and kingship be his for ever and ever. Amen. (Revelation 1:6)

### Offertory Antiphon:

## Hymn: O Redemptor sume Carmen

"O Redeemer, hear our singing as we praise you with one voice."

Communion Antiphon: For ever I will sing the goodness of the Lord; I will proclaim your faithfulness to all generations. (Psalm 89:2)

## Holy Thursday – Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper

Introit: We should glory in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, for he is our salvation, our life and our resurrection; through him we are saved and made free. (Galatians 6:14)

Antiphons during the Washing of Feet:

- 1. The Lord Jesus, when he had eaten with his disciples, poured water into a basin and began to wash their feet, saying: This example I leave you. (John 13:4,5,15)
- Lord, do you wash my feet? Jesus said to him: If I do not wash your feet, you can have no part with me. V. So he came to Simon Peter, who said to him: Lord, do you wash my feet? V. Now you do not know what I am doing, but later you will understand. Lord, do you wash my feet? (John 13:6-8)
- 3. If I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, then surely you must wash one another's feet. (John 13:14)
- 4. Jesus said to his disciples: If there is this love among you, all will know that you are my disciples. (John 13:35)
- 5. I give you a new commandment: Love one another as I have loved you, says the Lord. (John 13:34)
- 6. Faith, hope and love, let these endure among you; and the greatest of these is love. (1 Cor. 13:13)

## Offertory Antiphon:

Hymn: Ubi caritas et amor (Where Charity and love are found, there is God)

Communion Antiphon: This body will be given for you. This is the cup of the new covenant in my blood; whenever you receive them, do so in remembrance of me. (1 Cor. 11:24-25)

## Good Friday of the Lord's Passion

Antiphons and Music at the Veneration of the Cross:

- 1. We worship you, Lord; we venerate your cross, we praise your resurrection. Through the cross you brought joy to the world.
- 2. May God be gracious and bless us; and let his face shed its light upon us.
- 3. Reproaches I & II

## Holy Saturday / The Great Vigil of Easter

Offertory Antiphon: The right hand of the Lord is exalted; the right hand of the Lord has struck with power. I shall not die, but live, and declare the works of the Lord. (Psalm 118:16-17) [Verses of Psalm 118 can also be sung between repetitions of the antiphon.]

Communion Antiphon: Christ has become our paschal sacrifice; let us feast with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth, alleluia. (1 Cor. 5:7-8)

### ✤ The Resurrection of the Lord [Easter Sunday]

Introit: I have risen: I am with you once more; you placed your hand on me to keep me safe. How great is the depth of your wisdom, alleluia! (Psalm 139:18, 5-6)

Rite of Sprinkling Antiphon: I saw water flowing from the right side of the temple, alleluia. It brought God's life and his salvation, and the people sang in joyful praise: alleluia, alleluia. (Ezekiel 47:1-2, 9)

Offertory Antiphon: The earth feared and was silent when God arose for judgment, alleluia. (Psalm 76:9b-10a)

Communion Antiphon: Christ has become our paschal sacrifice; let us feast with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth, alleluia. (1 Cor. 5:7-8)

# **EASTER SEASON**

## ★ Second Sunday of Easter [Divine Mercy Sunday]

Introit: Rejoice to the full in the glory that is yours, and give thanks to God who called you to his kingdom, alleluia. (IV Ezra 2:36-37)

Offertory Antiphon: The angel of the Lord descended from heaven; he addressed to the women: I know you are looking for Jesus the crucified, but he has been raised, exactly as he promised, alleluia. (Matthew 28:2b, 5a, 6a) [*Verses of Psalm 63 can also be sung between repetitions of the antiphon.*]

Communion Antiphon: Jesus spoke to Thomas: put your hand here, and see the place of the nails. Doubt no longer, but believe, alleluia. (John 20:27)

✤ Third Sunday of Easter

Introit: Let all the earth cry out to God with joy; praise the glory of his name; proclaim his glorious praise, alleluia. (Psalm 65:1-2)

Offertory Antiphon: Praise the Lord, O my soul; I will praise the Lord all my life; I will sing praise to my God while I live, alleluia. (Psalm 146:1b-2) [*Verses of Psalm 63 can also be sung between repetitions of the antiphon.*]

Communion Antiphon: The disciples recognized the Lord Jesus in the breaking of bread, alleluia. (Luke 24:35)

★ Fourth Sunday of Easter [Good Shepherd Sunday & Vocation Sunday]
Introit: The earth is full of the goodness of the Lord; by the word of the Lord the heavens were made, alleluia. (Psalm 32:5-6)

Offertory Antiphon: O God, you are my God whom I seek; lifting up my hands, I will call upon your name, alleluia. (Psalm 63:2a, 5b) [*Verses of Psalm 63 can also be sung between repetitions of the antiphon.*]

Communion Antiphon: The Good Shepherd is risen! He who laid down his life for his sheep, who died for his flock, he is risen, alleluia.

#### ✤ Fifth Sunday of Easter

Introit: Sing to the Lord a new song, for he has done marvelous deeds; he has revealed to the nations his saving power, alleluia. (Psalm 98:1-2)

Offertory Antiphon: Shout joyfully to God, all you on earth, sing praise to the glory of his name. Hear now, all you who fear God, while I declare what he has done for me, alleluia. (Psalm 66:1b, 2a, 16) [*Verses of Psalm 47 can also be sung between repetitions of the antiphon.*]

Communion Antiphon: I am the vine and you are the branches, says the Lord; He who lives in me, and I in him, will bear much fruit, alleluia. (John 15:5)

#### ✤ Sixth Sunday of Easter

Introit: Speak out with a voice of joy; let it be heard to the ends of the earth: The Lord has set his people free, alleluia. (Isaiah 48:20)

Offertory Antiphon: Bless our God, you peoples, loudly sound his praise; He has given life to our souls, and has not let our feet slip. Blessed be God who refused me not my prayer or his kindness, alleluia! (Psalm 66:8,9,20) [Verses of Psalm 63 can also be sung between repetitions of the antiphon.]

Communion Antiphon: If you love me, keep my commandments, says the Lord. The Father will send you the Holy Spirit, to be with you for ever, alleluia. (John 14:15-16)

#### ✤ Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord

Introit: Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking in the sky? The Lord will return, just as you have seen him ascend, alleluia. (Acts 1:11)

Offertory Antiphon: God mounts his throne amid shouts of joy; the Lord, amid trumpet blasts, alleluia. (Psalm 47:6)

*OR* Men of Galilee, why do you stand here looking up at the skies? This Jesus who has been taken from you will return, just as you saw him go up into the heavens, alleluia. (Acts of the Apostles 1:11) [*Verses of Psalm 47 can also be sung between repetitions of the antiphon.*]

Communion Antiphon: I, the Lord, am with you always, until the end of the world, alleluia. (Matthew 28:20)

#### ★ Seventh Sunday of Easter

Introit: Lord, hear my voice when I call to you. My heart has prompted me to seek your face; I seek it, Lord; do not hide from me, alleluia. (Psalm 26)

Offertory Antiphon: God mounts his throne amid shouts of joy; the Lord, amid trumpet blasts, alleluia. (Psalm 47:6)

*OR* Men of Galilee, why do you stand here looking up at the skies? This Jesus who has been taken from you will return, just as you saw him go up into the heavens, alleluia. (Acts of the Apostles 1:11) [*Verses of Psalm 47 can also be sung between repetitions of the antiphon.*]

Communion Antiphon: This is the prayer of Jesus: that his believers may become one as he is one with the Father, alleluia. (John 17:22)

✤ Vigil of Pentecost

Introit: The love of God has been poured into our hearts by his Spirit living in us, alleluia. (Romans 5:5; 8:11)

Offertory Antiphon: When you send forth your spirit, they are created, and you renew the face of the earth. May the glory of the Lord endure forever, alleluia. (Psalm 104:30-31a) [*Verses of Psalm 68 can also be sung between repetitions of the antiphon.*]

Communion Antiphon: On the last day of the festival, Jesus stood and cried out: If anyone is thirsty, let him come to me and drink, alleluia. (John 7:37)

✤ Solemnity of Pentecost

Introit: The Spirit of the Lord fills the whole world. It holds all things together and knows every word spoken by man, alleluia. (Wisdom 1:7)

Offertory Antiphon: Show forth, O God, your power, the power, O God, with which you took our part; For your temple in Jerusalem let the kings bring you gifts. (Psalm 68:29-30) [*Verses of Psalm 68 can also be sung between repetitions of the antiphon.*]

Communion Antiphon: They were filled with the Holy Spirit, and they spoke of the great things God had done, alleluia. (Acts 2:4, 11)

# **ORDINARY TIME**

✤ Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: May all the earth give you worship and praise, and break into song to your name, O God, Most High (Psalm 65:4)

Offertory Antiphon: Shout joyfully to God, all you on earth; sing of his glorious name. Come and hear, all you who fear God, while I recount what he has done for me. [Verses of Psalm 113 or Psalm 125 can also be sung between repetitions of the antipihon.]

Communion Antiphon: The Lord has prepared a feast for me: given wine in plenty for me to drink (Psalm 22:5)

Third Sunday in Ordinary Time [Ecumenical Sunday]

Introit: Sing a new song to the Lord! Sing to the Lord, all the earth. Truth and beauty surround him, he lives in holiness and glory. (Psalm 96:1,6)

Offertory Antiphon: The Lord's right hand is raised, the Lord's right hand strikes with power. I shall not die but live and declare the deeds of the Lord. [Verses of Psalm 113 or Psalm 125 can also be sung between repetitions of the antiphon.]

Communion Antiphon: Look up at the Lord with gladness and smile; your face will never be ashamed (Psalm 33:6)

✤ Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: Save us, Lord our God, and gather us together from the nations, that we may proclaim your holy name and glory in your praise. (Psalm 105:47)

Offertory Antiphon: It is good to give thanks to the Lord, to sing praise to your name, Most High. [*Verses of Psalm 113 or Psalm 125 can also be sung between repetitions of the antiphon.*]

Communion Antiphon: Happy are the poor in spirit; the kingdom of heaven is theirs! Happy are the lowly; they shall inherit the land. (Matthew 5:3-4)

#### ✤ Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: Come, let us worship the Lord. Let us bow down in the presence of our maker, for he is the Lord our God (Psalm 95:6-7)

Offertory Antiphon: My steps have kept to your paths; my feet have not faltered. Turn your ear to me; hear my prayer. Show your wonderful love, you who deliver with your right arm those who seek refuge from their foes. [Verses of Psalm 113 or Psalm 125 can also be sung between repetitions of the antiphon.]

Communion Antiphon: Give praise to the Lord for his kindness, for his wonderful deeds toward men. He has filled the hungry with good things, he has satisfied the thirsty. (Psalm 107:8-9)

#### ✤ Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: Lord, be my rock of safety, my stronghold that saves me. For the honor of your name, lead me and guide me. (Psalm 31:3-4)

Offertory Antiphon: Blessed are you, O Lord; teach me your statutes. With my lips I declare all the ordinances of your mouth. (Psalm 119:12-13). [Verses of Pesalm 113 or Psalm 125 can also be sung between repetitions of the antiphons.]

Communion Antiphon: They ate and were filled; the Lord gave them what they wanted: they were not deprived of their desire (Psalm 78:29-30)

*OR* God loved the world so much, he gave his only Son, that all who believe in him might not perish, but might have eternal life. (John 3:16)

#### ✤ Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: Lord, your mercy is my hope, my heart rejoices in your saving power. I will sing to the Lord for his goodness to me. (Psalm 13:6)

Offertory Antiphon: Heed my call for help, my King and my God! To you I pray, O Lord. (Psalm 5:3-4a) [*Verses of Psalm 113 or Psalm 125 can also be sung between repetitions of the antiphon.*]

Communion Antiphon: I will tell all your marvelous works. I will rejoice and be glad in you, and sing to your name, Most High. (Psalm 9:2-3)

*OR* Lord, I believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, who was to come into the world. (John 11:27)

✤ Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: The Lord has been my strength; he has led me into freedom. He saved me because he loves me. (Psalm 18:19-20)

Offertory Antiphon: Return, O Lord, save my life; rescue me because of your kindness. (Psalm 6:5). [*Verses of Psalm 113 or Psalm 125 can also be sung between repetitions of the antiphon.*]

Communion Antiphon: I will sing to the Lord for his goodness to me, I will sing the name of the Lord, Most High. (Psalm 13:6)

OR I, the Lord, am with you always, until the end of the world. (Matthew 28:20)

#### ✤ Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: O look at me and be merciful, for I am wretched and alone. See my hardship and my poverty, and pardon all my sins. (Psalm 25:16, 18)

Offertory Antiphon: Let those who know your name trust in you, O Lord; for you do not abandon those who seek you. Sing psalms to the Lord who dwells in Zion; for he does not forget the cry of the poor. (Psalm 10:11-13). [Verses of Psalm 13 can also be sung between repetitions of the antiphon.]

Communion Antiphon: I call upon you, God, for you will answer me; bend your ear and hear my prayer. (Psalm 17:6)

#### ▲ Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: The Lord is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear? The Lord is the stronghold of my life; whom should I dread? When those who do evil draw near, they stumble and fall. (Ps. 27 (26):1-2)

Communion Antiphon: The Lord is my rock, my fortress, and my deliverer; my God is my saving strength. (Ps. 18 (17):3)

OR God is love, and whoever abides in love abides in God, and God in him. (1 Jn 4:16)

#### ▲ Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: Lord, hear my voice when I call to you. You are my help; do not cast me off, do not desert me, my Savior God. (Psalm 26:7, 9)

Offertory Antiphon: I bless the Lord who counsels me. I se the Lord ever before me; with him at my right hand I shall not be disturbed. (Psalm 16:7a, 8) [*Verses of Psalm 125 can also be sung between repetitions of the antiphon.*]

Communion Antiphon: One thing I seek: to dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life. (Psalm 26:4)

OR Father, keep in your name those you have given me, that they may be one as we are one, says the Lord. (John 17:11)

#### ✤ Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: The Lord is the strength of his people, a saving refuge for the one he has anointed. Save your people, Lord, and bless your heritage, and govern them for ever. (Ps. 28 (27):8-9)

Offertory Antiphon: My steps have been steadfast in your paths, my feet have not faltered. Incline your ear to me; hear my word. Show your wondrous kindness, Lord, to those who hope in your salvation. (Psalm 17:5,6b,7) *Verses of Psalm 128 -or- Psalm 125 can also be sung between repetitions of the antiphon.* 

Communion antiphon: The eyes of all look to you, Lord, and you give them their food in due season. (Ps. 145 (144):15)

OR I am the Good shepherd, and I lay down my life for my sheep, says the Lord. (Jn 10:11, 15)

#### ✤ Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: All nations, clap your hands. Shout with a voice of joy to God. (Psalm 47:2)

Offertory Antiphon: As thought it were holocausts of rams and bullocks, or thousands of fat lambs, so let our sacrifice be in your presence today as we follow you unreservedly; for those who trust in you

cannot be put to shame. (Daniel 3:40) [Verses of Psalm 128 or Psalm 125 can also be sung between repetitions of the antiphon.]

Communion Antiphon: O bless the Lord, my soul, and all that is within me bless his holy name. (Psalm 103:1)

OR Father, I pray for them: may they be one in us, so that the world may believe it was you who sent me. (John 17:2-21)

#### ✤ Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: Within your temple, we ponder your living kindness, O God. As your name, so also your praises reaches to the ends of the earth; your right hand is filled with justice.

Offertory Antiphon: Lowly people you save but haughty eyes you bring low. For who is God except the Lord? (Psalm 18:28, 32a) [*Verses of Psalm 47 can also be sung between repetitions of the antiphon.*]

Communion Antiphon: Taste and see the goodness of the Lord; blessed is he who hopes in God. [Psalm 34:9]

#### ➡ Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: In my justice I shall see your face, O Lord; when your glory appears, my joy will be full. (Psalm 17:15)

Offertory Antiphon: To you I lift up my soul, O Lord, my God. In you I trust; let me not be put to shame, let not my enemies exult over me. No one who waits for you shall be put to shame. (Psalm 25:1-3a) [*Verses of Psalm 5 can also be sung between repetitions of the antiphon.*]

Communion Antiphon: The sparrow even finds a home, the swallow a nest wherein to place here young, near to your altars, Lord of hosts, my King, my God! How happy they who dwell in your house! For ever they are praising you. (Psalm 84:4-5)

## ▲ Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: God himself is my help. The Lord upholds my life. I will offer you a willing sacrifice; I will praise your name, O Lord, for its goodness. (Psalm 54:6,8)

Offertory Antiphon: The precepts of the Lord are right, rejoicing the heart, sweeter also than syrup or honey from the comb. Your servant is diligent in keeping them. (Psalm 19:9, 11b, 12) [Verses of Psalm 54 can also be sung between repetitions of the antiphon.]

Communion Antiphon: The Lord keeps in our minds the wonderful things he has done. He is compassion and love; he always provides for his faithful. (Psalm 111:4-5)

## ✤ Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: God is in his holy dwelling; he will give a home to the lonely; he gives power and strength to his people. (Psalm 68,6,7,36)

Offertory Antiphon: I will extol you, O Lord, for you drew me clear and did not my enemies rejoice over me. O Lord, my God, I cried out to you and you healed me. (Psalm 30:2-3) [Verses of Psalm 140 can also be sung between repetitions of the antiphon.]

Communion Antiphon: O bless the Lord, my soul, and remember all his kindness. (Psalm 103:2)

### ✤ Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: God, come to my help. Lord, quickly give me assistance. You are the one who helps me and sets me free: Lord, do not be long in coming. (Psalm 70)

Offertory Antiphon: But Moses implored the Lord, his God, saying, "Why are you angry with your people, Lord? Let your wrath die down. Remember your servants Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, whom you promised to give a land flowing with milk and honey." So the Lord relented in the punishment he had threatened to inflict on his people. (Exodus 32:11a, 12d, 13a, 13c, 14) [*Verses of Psalm 13 can also be sung between repetitions of the antiphon.*]

Communion Antiphon: You gave us bread from heaven, Lord: a sweet-tasting bread that was very good to eat. (Wisdom 16:20)

#### ✤ Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Offertory Antiphon: The angel of the Lord encamps around those who fear him, and delivers them. Taste and see how good the Lord is. (Psalm 34:8-9a) [*Verses of Psalm 128 can also be sung between repetitions of the antiphon.*]

Communion Antiphon: With the Lord there is mercy, and fullness of redemption (Psalm 130:7)

#### ✤ Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: Listen, Lord, and answer me. Save your servant who trusts in you. I call to you all day long, have mercy on me, O Lord. (Psalm 86:1-3)

Offertory Antiphon: I have waited, waited for the Lord, and he stooped toward me and heard my cry. And he put a new song into my mouth, a hymn to our God. (Psalm 40:2,4a) [Verses of Psalm 113 can also be sung between repetitions of the antiphon.]

Communion Antiphon: Lord, the earth is filled with your gift from heaven; man grows bread from the earth, and wine to cheer his heart. (Psalm 104:13-15)

Offertory Antiphon: There was a blames and upright man named Job, who feared God. So Satan was given power of Job's possessions and over his flesh, and he destroyed his property and sons and smote Job with severe boils. (Job 1:1b; 2:7). [Verses of Psalm 113 or Psalm 125 can also be sung between repetitions of the antiphon.]

Communion Antiphon: The Lord is good to those who hope in him, to those who are searching for his love. (Lamentations 3:25)

*OR* Because there is one bread, we, though many, are one body, for we all share in the one loaf and in the one cup. (1 Corinthians 10:17)

★ Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time [Vocation Awareness] Introit: If you, O Lord, laid bare our guilt, who could endure it? But you are forgiving, God of Israel. (Psalm 130:3-4)

Offertory Antiphon: Remember me, O Lord, King of all power: and put a well-ordered speech in my mouth, that my words may be pleasing in your sight. (Esther 14:12-13). [Verses of Psalm 113 or Psalm 125 can also be sung between repetitions of the antiphon.]

Communion Antiphon: The rich suffer want and go hungry, but nothing is lacking to those who fear the Lord. (Psalm 33:11)

OR When the Lord is revealed we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is.

✤ Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: I call upon you, God, for you will answer me; bend your ear and hear my prayer. Guard me as the pupil of your eye; hide me in the shade of your wings. (Psalm 16:6, 8)

Offertory Antiphon: And I will delight in your commands, which I love. And I will lift up my hands to your commands and meditate on your statutes. (Psalm 119:47-48). [Verses of Psalm 113 or Psalm 125 can also be sung between repetitions of the antiphon.]

Communion Antiphon: See how the eyes of the Lord are on those who fear him, on those who hope for his love, that he may rescue them from death and feed them in time of famine. (Psalm 32:18-19)

OR The Son of Man came to give his life as a ransom for many. (Mark 10:45)

## Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time [World Mission Sunday]

Introit: Let hearts rejoice who search for the Lord. Seek the Lord and his strength, seek always the face of the Lord. (Psalm 105:3-4)

Offertory Antiphon: O Lord, give me life according to your word. Give me discernment that I may know your decrees. (Psalm 119:107b, 125b) [Verses of Psalm 113 or Psalm 125 can also be sung between repetitions of the antiphon.]

Communion Antiphon: We will rejoice at the victory of God and make our boast in his great name. (Psalm 20:6)

Thirty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time [Reformation Sunday]

Introit: Do not abandon me, Lord. My God, do not go away from me! Hurry to help me, Lord, my savior. (Psalm 38:22-23)

Offertory Antiphon: Bless the Lord, O my soul, and forget not all his benefits; your youth is renewed like an eagle. (Psalm 103:2,5b). [Verses of Psalm 113 or Psalm 125 can also be sung between repetitions of the antiphon.]

Introit: Let my prayer come before you, Lord: Listen, and answer me. (Psalm 88:3)

Steady my footsteps according to your promise, and let no iniquity rule over me. (Psalm 119:133) [*Verses of Psalm 113 or Psalm 125 can also be sung between repetitions of the antiphon.*]

Communion Antiphon: The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want. In green pastures he gives me rest, he leads me beside the waters of peace. (Psalm 23:1-2)

#### ✤ Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time [Bible Sunday]

Introit: The Lord says: my plans for you are peace and not disaster; when you call to me, I will listen to you, and I will bring you back to the place from which I exiled you. (Jer 29:11, 12, 14)

Offertory Antiphon: Out of the depths I cry to you, O Lord; Lord, hear my voice! (Psalm 130:1bc) [*Verses of Psalm 113 or Psalm 125 can also be sung between repetitions of the antiphon.*]

Communion Antiphon: It is good for me to be with the Lord and to put my hope in him. (Psalm 73:28)

Offertory Antiphon: Mary has been taken up to heaven; the angels rejoice. They bless the Lord and sing his praises.

*OR* By you the gates of paradise have been opened to us; today you triumph gloriously with the angels.

*OR* Hail, Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with you; blessed are you among women. (Luke 1:28)

[Verses of Psalm 96 or Psalm 85 can also be sung between repetitions of the antiphon.]

## ✤ 14 September: Exaltation of the Holy Cross

Introit: We should glory in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, for he is our salvation, our life and our resurrection; through him we are saved and made free. (Gal. 6:14)

Communion Antiphon: When I am lifted up from the earth, I will draw all men to myself, says the Lord. (John 12:32)

## ▲ 1 November: Solemnity of All Saints

Introit: Let us rejoice in the Lord and keep a festival in honor of all the saints. Let us join with the angels in joyful praise to the Son of God.

Offertory Antiphon: The souls of the just are in the hand of God, and no torment shall touch them. They seem in the view of the foolish to be dead, but they are at peace, alleluia. (Wisdom 3:1,2a 3b)

OR I will give my Saints an everlasting name; joy and gladness shall be theirs forever. (Sirach 15:6) [Verses of Psalm 5 can also be sung between repetitions of the antiphon.]

Just as in Adam all men die, so in Christ all will be made alive. (1 Thessalonians 4:14; I Corinthians 15:22)

Communion Antiphon: I am the resurrection and the life, says the Lord. If anyone believes in me, even though he dies, he will live. Anyone who lives and believes in me, will not die. (John 11:25-26)

# 9 November: Feast of the Dedication St. John Lateran Basilica

Introit: Greatly to be feared is God in his sanctuary; he, the God of Israel, gives power and strength to his people. Blessed be God! (Psalm (67) 68:36)

# DECREE

# In time of Covid-19 (II)

Considering the rapidly evolving situation of the Covid-19 pandemic and taking into account observations which have come from Episcopal Conferences, this Congregation now offers an update to the general indications and suggestions already given to Bishops in the preceding decree of 19 March 2020.

Given that the date of Easter cannot be transferred, in the countries which have been struck by the disease and where restrictions around the assembly and movement of people have been imposed, Bishops and priests may celebrate the rites of Holy Week without the presence of the people and in a suitable place, avoiding concelebration and omitting the sign of peace.

The faithful should be informed of the beginning times of the celebrations so that they can prayerfully unite themselves in their homes. Means of live (not recorded) telematic broadcasts can be of help. In any event it remains important to dedicate an adequate time to prayer, giving importance above all to the *Liturgia Horarum*.

The Episcopal Conferences and individual dioceses will see to it that resources are provided to support family and personal prayer.

1 - **Palm Sunday.** The Commemoration of the Lord's Entrance into Jerusalem is to be celebrated within sacred buildings; in Cathedral churches the second form given in the Roman Missal is to be adopted; in parish churches and in other places the third form is to be used.

2 – **The Chrism Mass**. Evaluating the concrete situation in different countries, the Episcopal Conferences will be able to give indications about a possible transfer to another date.

3 - Holy Thursday. The washing of feet, which is already optional, is to be omitted. At the end of the Mass of the Lord's Supper the procession is also omitted and the Blessed Sacrament is to be kept in the tabernacle. On this day the faculty to celebrate Mass in a suitable place, without the presence of the people, is exceptionally granted to all priests.

4 – **Good Friday**. In the Universal Prayer, Bishops will arrange to have a special intention prepared for those who find themselves in distress, the sick, the dead, (cf. *Missale Romanum*). The adoration of the Cross by kissing it shall be limited solely to the celebrant.

5 – **The Easter Vigil**: Is to be celebrated only in Cathedral and parish churches. For the "Baptismal Liturgy" only the "Renewal of Baptismal Promises" is maintained (cf. *Missale Romanum*).

Seminaries, houses of clergy, monasteries and religious communities shall follow the indications of this decree.

Expressions of popular piety and processions which enrich the days of Holy Week and the Paschal Triduum can be transferred to other suitable days in the year, for example 14 and 15 September, according to the judgement of the Diocesan Bishop.
