RE: Providing Financial Assistance to Ukraine

Recently, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) informed dioceses that the annual collection for the Church in Central and Eastern Europe (which was already taken up on Ash Wednesday) will be the source of funding for the Bishops' response to the war in Ukraine. There will not be a separate special collection – meaning the USCCB and the Diocese of Manchester will not be calling or holding an emergency collection for the war in Ukraine.

However, we recognize that there is great concern for the escalating situation in Ukraine and would like to ensure that pastors, parishioners, and interested donors have information accessible to give to Catholic agencies providing aid and support to Ukraine. If pastors have already held a second collection, please refer to the agencies below to issue your collection funds. Rather than parishes taking up special collections for this purpose, we recommend that you refer anyone interested in providing assistance directly to one or more of the following four agencies.

I. The international Caritas confederation is collecting funds to help Caritas Ukraine. In the United States, that is through <u>Catholic Relief Services</u>.
