IMMIGRATION REFORM WHAT CAN WE DO?

Educate Others

- Talk to your pastor about how best to educate parishioners (e.g., distribute the Diocese of Manchester parish bulletin flyer on Catholic social teaching on immigration, hold a forum for parishioners on immigration; host a showing of a film on immigration, etc.).
- Facilitate a discussion about immigration at a Faithful Citizenship Committee or other parish group meeting (including Parish Council, Religious Education, St. Vincent de Paul etc.), using the materials from the USCCB Justice for Immigrants website: www.justiceforimmigrants.org.
- Download and distribute the documents from the Justice for Immigrants Parish Plan from the USCCB website: www.justiceforimmigrants.org.
- Host a showing of One Border, One Body: Immigration and the Eucharist (http://oneborderonebody.nd.edu/) or Dying to Live: A Migrant's Journey (http://dyingtolive.nd.edu/). Both videos are available to borrow from the Diocese of Manchester Public Policy Office. Discussion guide also available.

Become Engaged

- Speak with elected officials and advocate for immigrants by discussing the realities of immigration and the need
 for comprehensive immigration reform at the federal level as proposed by the United States Bishops:

- Promote social services for immigrants: immigration legal services; citizenship workshops; citizenship prep classes; English classes.
